

Working With Your Collections: Text and Interpretation

This workshop will be a day-long event that will explore that will explore how museums can effectively use text to engage their visitors. Through a combination of guided discussion and practical exercises, participants will explore principles and best practices for the use of text in a wide range of mediums including exhibit text and labels, interpretive panels, screen-based media, promotional materials and websites. Participants will learn how the effective use of text and interpretation methods can make their collections available to the community while keeping artifacts safe for future generations. Participants will also learn what materials and techniques are safe for their collections when performing interpretive activities. Other topics include: reading in the museum environment (visitor challenges, needs and preferences); selecting an appropriate voice, tone and style; copy length; legibility and accessibility; visitor attraction and retention; text as graphic - the crucial role of typography and design; and creating a visual hierarchy.
